



Mandatory Safety Rules for Visiting Temple

- ❖ **Anyone with a fever or symptoms of COVID-19 will NOT be permitted** to enter inside the temple.
- ❖ All Devotees **must wear face mask, covering their mouth and nose, at all times** while in temple premises. (Temple does not supply any face masks to devotees)
- ❖ **Devotees must clean their hands with hand-sanitizer** before entering any temple building in the premises
- ❖ Devotees will be allowed to enter & leave only through North side entrance.
- ❖ **Maintain at least 6 ft social distance from other devotees, except for family members.** Devotees must follow other safety signs posted in temple, and as-directed by Temple Priests or authorized Volunteers.
- ❖ While inside the temple, **at all times** avoid touching handrails, barriers, pillars or other surfaces to avoid exposure to virus.
- ❖ Only limited number of people will be allowed in the temple, at a given time, and **Devotees should follow the directions and complete Darshan.**
- ❖ **Standing in front of altars or sitting in meditation is not allowed. Devotees expected to leave the temple building within 5 to 7 min upon entering.**
- ❖ Restrooms, shower, Shoe/Jacket rooms will be closed and not accessible to devotees. Devotees should keep this in mind and plan accordingly.
- ❖ No *Theertham and Prasadam* will be given to devotees by priests.
- ❖ **Use of Face masks and all the above rules apply while visiting *Dwarkamayji/Dhuni Mandir and Gurusthan*, as well.**
- ❖ People should not gather in groups and engage in conversations within temple premises
- ❖ Devotees can sit (if permitted) only at the marked locations inside the temple, and still maintain social distance.
- ❖ All devotees are encouraged to wear traditional dresses while visiting the temple
